Draft Criteria	Measurement
Race and Ethnicity	• Non-White population
Income	• Low-income households
Cost of Living	• Households with high housing and transportation costs
Air Quality	• Pollution levels
Age	• Population 17 years or younger
	• Population 65 years or older
Disability Status	• Population with a disability
Limited English Proficiency	• Households with limited English proficiency
Amount of Education	• Population without high school diploma

Access Criteria



Draft Criteria	Measurement
Lack of Access to a Car	Households with more workers than cars available
Limited Access to Jobs and Opportunities	Jobs available within a 30-minute drive
	Jobs available within 30 minutes on transit
Limited Transit Access and High Transit Usage	- Transit station access - Transit trips
Congestion	Traffic levels
Physical Barriers	Block size and land use
	Presence of highways, railroads, major manufacturing sites, and logistics
Lack of Safety	- Crash hotspots - Bicycle and pedestrian crash hotspots
Limited Access to Key Destinations	- Distance to key destinations, including: - Grocery store or supermarket - Stores and restaurants - Parks and trails - Elementary schools - Community centers, libraries, and sports fields - Hospitals, medical offices, and clinics

Draft Criteria	Measurement
Environmental Factors	• Public health burdens
	• Urban Heat Island Index
	• Truck traffic
Limited Transportation Options	• Supercommuters (commuting for more than 60 minutes)
	• Trips made by carpool, transit, walking, or biking
Lack of Multimodal Infrastructure	• Sidewalks
	• Bike facilities
	• Bus shelter or benches at a transit stop
Poor Road Quality	• Poor pavement condition

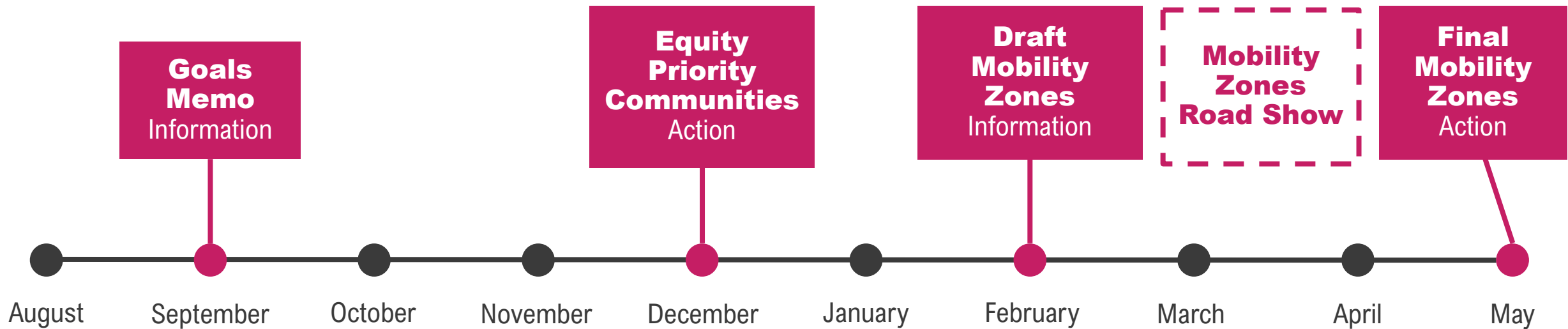
